- Use technologies that build student's self-esteem
- Identify technologies that develop strengths and interests
- Integrate technology that promotes a problem-based curriculum designed to engage the learner in real-world learning
- Develop coping strategies
- Allow for multiple product development options
- Utilize technology that facilitates cooperation among parents, gifted specialists, learning disability specialists, general classroom teachers, and the student

Read & Write Gold software	Program that allows students learn to read and write at their own pace. Allows students to speak into the system, which in turn converts it into text that appears on the screen in front of them. The software is not limited to a specific set of text it can read. Students can change preferences such as voice gender, speed, and pitch. Graphic Organizers	Provides guided worksheets that students follow throughout the reading process so that they remember what they read and how to spot important information within a text. 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Text messaging devices	Device that allows user to send messages via words typed in on an attached keyboard.	Quick and easy to get a message across.	Texting language is very informal so abbreviations make it a much more convenient to communicate with others. All cell phones have this ability and it has become inexpensive when purchasing a text-messaging package.	Students are getting confused when writing in school, as to what correct grammar and punctuation is. Book Builder	Book Builder is a website that lets users create, read, and publish digital books. Teachers or other students can record themselves while reading and then store that session on the computer. Students can then go back and listen while following along on the screen as someone else reads the story.	Students who have difficulty reading can listen to other students their same age read a story so that they can understand how they are pronouncing and form words.	Students who are nervous to read in front of others can now read while alone and record themselves while they do. Teachers can then go back later to make sure students are progressing at a normal pace or pinpoint areas of concern. Video capture and editing software	This strategy helps students to communicate in an alternative way if their verbal skills are not strong.
